The *Foundation for World Peace* (Promoting Committee) is made up of bodies and/or associations that promote processes of peace, freedom and the affirmation of inalienable human rights.

Among the bodies constituting the *Foundation for World Peace*, there are the Academy of Philosophical Arts and Sciences of Bari and the Lèopold Sèdar Senghor International Academy of Arcore (MB) committed to building and spreading the culture of peace, justice and equality. , of brotherhood, of non-violence, of respect for human rights, of peaceful coexistence between peoples, of integration between different cultures and religions, for a society that does not know xenophobia, racism and discrimination, individualism and competition, promoting recognition mutual, dialogue, comparison, inclusion.

In this context, the *Foundation for World Peace* (Promoting Committee) announces the first edition of the **Peace, Freedom and Human Rights International Award** (P.F.HR. International Award for short) whose awards ceremony will take place on **19 September 2026** on the occasion of the International Day of Peace established by the United Nations General Assembly in 1981 (resolution A/RES/36/67) with the aim of strengthening the desire for peace among peoples.

The awarding of three Awards is envisaged to pay homage to and support personalities of recognized intellectual stature, institutions and private or public bodies that contribute significantly to the promotion, research and maintenance of Peace in the world, and in defense of human rights and of fundamental freedoms, in compliance with the provisions of the UN General Assembly.

The following Awards will be awarded:

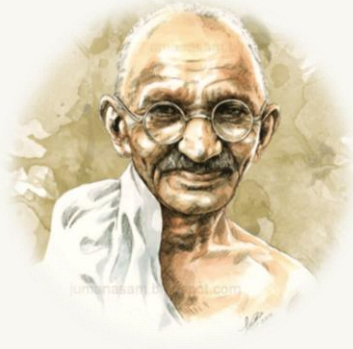
- **Mahatma Gandhi, Peace Award** for the affirmation of peace through non-violence
- **Martin Luther King, Freedom Award** for the affirmation of equality between men
- **Nelson Mandela, Human Rigths Award** for the affirmation of freedom and dignity

whose assignees are united by the awareness of how necessary it is to promote Peace, equality, social justice, human rights, disarmament, fundamental freedoms and by the desire to dedicate their lives to this difficult, but not impossible, battle.

Nominations are free and can be proposed by anyone who is a "citizen of the world" (including self-nominations), private individuals, bodies or institutions, by sending a dossier, which will be treated confidentially, together with the presentation form.

The Scientific Committee of the *Foundation for World Peace* (Promoting Committee), composed of ten members representing different countries, cultures and religions, all involved in movements for the affirmation of peace, has the task of evaluating and selecting, among the various applications received , those worthy of nomination.

The deadline for submitting applications is set for **March 31, 2026**.

Peace Award

For the affirmation of Peace through non-violence

Gandhi, the greatest politician and spiritual leader of India and of the independence movement from the English colonial empire, known as Mahatma, the *great soul*, represents a point of reference for the builders of a world of peace, indispensable for growth of human conscience that can only arise from the united commitment of all men.

The **Gandhi Prize** is awarded to individuals or organizations who, with their actions and work, spread the ideas, principles and philosophical thought of Mohandas Gandhi through peaceful initiatives and non-violent methods, aimed at recognizing equal human dignity, freedom and equal inalienable rights of every man.

Freedom Award

For the affirmation of equality between men

Martin Luter King, American activist, politician and Protestant pastor, leader of the African-American civil rights movement, represents a point of reference for the builders of a world of peace. He was an undisputed promoter of the struggle for the emancipation of blacks and for the conquest of human rights, embracing the fundamental dictates of Gandhi's non-violence.

The **King Prize** is awarded to individuals or organizations who, with their actions and work, spread the ideas, principles and philosophical thought of Martin Luther King through initiatives aimed at seeking equality and non-discrimination which are the basis of his American dream and the human dream.

**For the affirmation of freedom of expression,

Politician and activist, he was the first black President of South Africa from 1994 to 1999. Antagonist of apartheid, he dedicated his life against racial segregationism.

REGULATION

Participation in the **P.F.HR. International Award**, is completely free and is extended to all candidates of any nationality.

Candidates must send all documentation **exclusively** in electronic format (pdf) to the email address foundation.wpeace@gmail.com attaching, in separate files::

- a) **participation form**
- b) detailed **biography** attaching what is necessary to prove
- c) Peace promotion activities
- d) good quality color **photograph** in jpg format.

Each candidate will receive a confirmation of receipt within three (3) days following the submission of the email. Applications that do not comply with the provisions of this regulation **will not be considered**.

Furthermore, any applications submitted without the form, biography, or photograph will be grounds for exclusion..

The compositions must be submitted by **11:59 PM on March 31, 2026** (the email's sending date will be considered valid).

All applications will be evaluated by the members of the Scientific Committee appointed by the *Foundation for World Peace* (Promoter Committee), which consists of prominent figures and representatives from the international intellectual community. The committee's decision is final and cannot be appealed..

The award ceremony will take place on **September 19, 2026**. Recipients of the Recognition will be notified in a timely manner and must confirm their attendance at the event. The awards must be collected in person by the recipient. Failure to do so will result in the revocation of the assigned Recognition.

The event will be widely publicized through print media, the web, and TV. The organization does not provide any reimbursement for travel and accommodation expenses.

Participation in the **P.F.HR. International Award** implies the candidates' authorization for the dissemination of their data on the Award's promotional and informational materials, along with any photos of the award ceremony published in newspapers, cultural magazines, and social networks.

Participation in the **P.F.HR. International Award** constitutes unconditional acceptance of all the articles in this regulation, which are binding for all candidates. By participating, candidates waive any and all future claims against the *Foundation For World Peace* (Promoting Committee).
